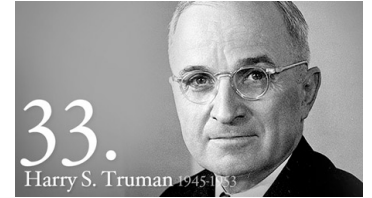




Cold War Presidential Timeline

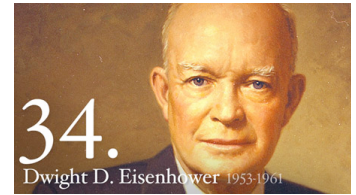

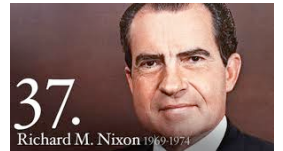

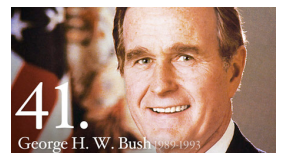
